# Partner and funding update

- Discussed with the direction of IPGP: Funding would likely need to come from the Université Paris Cité. Marc Chaussidon (Director) will soon discuss this with the Université Paris Cité president (Edouard Kaminski).
- Will assess alternative funding sources after hearing back from UPC (such as Europlanets).
- Discussed with Paul Byrne about his initiative to create a professional planetary science society. Their initiative just started, but there are obvious possibilities for collaboration in the future.
- We are open to alternative solutions!

# Indexing and Impact-factor update

- Volcanica is indexed in Web of Science and will soon have an impact factor. The other diamond open access journals have not yet started the process.
- It took 2.5 years for Volcanica to get accepted into the Web of Science Core Collection. Since then, Clarivate has simplified the process somewhat.
- Email from Clarivate:

"There is no set length of time a journal should exist nor a set number of articles a journal must have published before it can be submitted for evaluation. Per our Timeliness and/or Publication Volume criterion, "The volume of scholarly articles published annually should demonstrate the journal is attracting sufficient interest from the relevant scholarly community to be sustainable. The journal must also have published enough content across the breadth of its scope to allow comprehensive evaluation." If you feel there is enough content to allow for evaluation according to our criteria, then you can submit it whenever in the journal's life cycle you are ready to do so."

"If a journal is accepted, we index the current and 2 prior year's content from the date of acceptance."

• We should start the evaluation process by the end of the first year.

- 3) Planetaria
- 4) Open Journal of Planetary Research (OJPR)
- 5) Journal of Planetary Research (JPR)
- 6) Open Journal of Planetary Science (OJPS)
- 7) Open Planetary Science (OPS)

We can add additional choices, but today is the last day to do so (i.e., Planetology?). The final vote will start tomorrow and will run until the end of the year. We will use ranked choice voting, so every vote counts, even when your preferred choice is eliminated.

- 1. Planetary Research: Short two word name with no acronym. Distinguishes from other journals with "planetary science" in their title. Searching for "planetary research" only brings up "Planetary science" websites.
- 2. Advances in Planetary Research (APR): Similar to "Advances in Space Research".
- 3. Planetaria: Unique, single word name, similar to other geoscience diamond open access journals. An existing title exists in Brazil, but it is ok if two journals have the same title. Could be confused with the existing title "Planetarian" and "The Planetarian", and could be confused with planetariums in general. Not sure how this will be viewed 5-10 years from now.
- 4. Open Journal of Planetary Research (OJPR): Not sure what "Open" means and if this will be relevant in 5-10 years.
- 5. Journal of Planetary Research (JPR): Similar to Journal of Geophysical Research.
- 6. Open Journal of Planetary Science (OJPS): "Planetary Science Journal" rearranged with "Open" added to it.
- 7. Open Planetary Science (OPS): More appropriate for an initiative or association.
